PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Construction of a new bridge across the Hudson River, consisting of two structures, between Rockland County and Westchester County, to replace the existing Tappan Zee Bridge. The subject applications seek permits for the following components of the Replacement Bridge:

- Construction of two parallel bridge structures from landings in Rockland County and Westchester County, utilizing one of two proposed design alternatives (Short Span or Long Span); and one of two proposed structural options (Cable-Stayed or Arch) for the span over the Hudson River navigation channel. This work will require the installation of piles, pile caps, and other structures necessary for either option to support the roadway.
- Dredging approximately 1.9 million cubic yards of sediment over approximately 175
 acres of the River to enable water access during construction and demolition. The
 majority of dredging will take place north of the existing bridge; a small area will be
 dredged to the south of the existing bridge near the Westchester shoreline.
- Covering, or "armoring," the dredged area with approximately 400,000 cubic yards of sand and stone to prevent construction vessel prop wash from dislodging the sediment and dispersing it into the water column.
- 4. Construction of approximately 2.5 acres of permanent pile-supported platforms over the River on the Rockland County shoreline.
- 5. Demolition and removal of the existing Tappan Zee Bridge.

PROJECT LOCATION

The Replacement Bridge will span the Hudson River, just north of the present location of the existing Tappan Zee Bridge, from the Village of Nyack in Rockland County to the Village of Tarrytown in Westchester County.

PERMITS

Tidal Wetlands permit pursuant to NYS Environmental Conservation Law Article 25 and its implementing regulations at 6 NYCRR Part 661.

Water Quality Certification under Section 401 of the Clean Water Act, U.S. Public Law 95-217, and 33 USC 1341; and its NYS implementing regulations at 6 NYCRR Part 608.

Incidental Take permit pursuant to NYS Environmental Conservation Law Article 11, and its implementing regulations at 6 NYCRR Part 182.

STATE ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY REVIEW ACT

Pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA, ECL Article 8 and 6 NYCRR Part 617), the project is defined as Type I action. A Draft Environmental Impact Statement has been prepared under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969, for which the Federal Highway Administration is the lead agency and NYSDOT and NYSTA are joint lead agencies. In accordance with 6 NYCRR §617.15, the NEPA and SEQRA processes for the Project are being coordinated. The Department of Environmental Conservation may make a permit decision only after the Federal Final EIS has been completed, and the Department has made the findings required by §617.11.

TENTATIVE DEPARTMENT POSITION AND DOCUMENT AVAILABILITY

The Department has reviewed the application materials and determined that they are complete pursuant to 6 NYCRR Part 621. It has determined that all statutory and regulatory criteria can be met through the imposition of permit special conditions. A draft permit has been prepared.
